

## **JARROD SPARKS SUCCESS**

N APPRENTICE electrician has won the state's most prestigious vocational training and training award at last night's South Australian Training Awards, hosted by the Training and Skills Commission.

Jarrod Morton, 21, of Greenwith, has recently completed his apprenticeship with PEER - which also was named Training Provider of the Year at the awards - and is now employed as an electrician.

"I applied for the SA Training Awards because I want to encourage others to do what I've been doing," he says. "Through my apprenticeship I've grown not only as an electrician, but as a person as well. My confidence is higher, and I'm now responsible for running my own jobs from start to finish.

"I aspire to be where my boss is now, running his own company, and plan to go on to study electrical engineering as
